Our assemblies help children to explore and learn about the multicultural society in which they live. Religious festivals, educational events and significant dates throughout the year are acknowledged and current affairs (where appropriate) are also discussed. This may be through assemblies or through classroom based collective worship. Children also are encouraged to reflect on difference, equality and the nine protected characteristics (particularly through No Outsiders)

The content of assemblies may include stories, songs, videos, drama and music. All assemblies are designed to be thought provoking, inviting the children to reflect on their learning and explore things further. Where appropriate, visitors will be invited to deliver or join in with school assemblies. A whole school "celebration" assembly takes place on a Friday. During this assembly, children's achievements (linked to the ASPIRE curriculum) are celebrated, and class privileges are awarded to classes with the best attendance. Children are invited to present a kindness award to a classmate, and the 50 book challenge and author of the month are also discussed.

Children take an active role during assembly time. Year 6 children have a particularly important role to play, and may act as door monitors, computer monitors or music monitors. These roles are rotated each half term.
