Dear Parents and Carers,

### **Key Priorities**

Last term, our key priority was to review how we teach reading and introduced the reciprocal reading approach across school. This way of learning allows the children to be much more involved in their lessons through taking on specific roles to help them learn reading skills. If you were unable to attend the reading workshops that took place last term, please see the **Parent Reading workshop PowerPoint** in the **English and Languages** section of the school website for more information. Every three weeks, staff assess children's levels to make sure that they are reading the correct colour band books as well as working on specific targets to enable children to improve their reading skills.



The 100 Books to Read Challenge is working well to encourage children to read a wide range of books for pleasure. Please ensure that you listen to your children read at home and sign their reading diaries, which will be checked every Friday by a member of staff. We have already seen the impact that this is having upon children's reading fluency and outcomes in assessments.

# Writing at Nevill Road Juniors

This term, we are particularly focusing on children's presentation in books and consistent use of correct spellings, punctuation and grammar. We are also encouraging children to edit, improve and redraft their writing to help them to produce quality pieces.

#### Priority 2 – To improve the quality of education for all children in writing through

- Using 'Books for Hooks' to make links with reading and quality texts that expose children to challenging vocabulary.
- Developing DEAL strategies across the school to immerse and engage children in their writing.
- To ensure that Year Group 'Bear Necessities' are picked up and addressed by staff and children with a focus on SPAG and presentation.
- Implementing the new SPAG framework across school.
- To develop the use of editing and improving to show progress in writing.
- Quality first teaching that meets the needs of all children.

Several of our children across the Junior School have recently become published authors as part of the Young Writers project. If you would like to read their poems, a copy of 'Poetry Monsters' can be found in the school library.

## Keeping children safe

Last week we introduced the children to the lockdown procedure as a way of keeping the children safe should an intruder or a stray dog enter the building. The children asked excellent questions and understood that it is highly unlikely
